Whereas, The Pennsylvania State Employee's Pension System currently has 47 billion dollars of unfunded liabilities; and

Whereas, Public School Districts all over the Commonwealth are doing whatever they can to keep their budgets in line by cutting costs wherever they can because of the burden of the unfunded pensions; and
